## MRS. BURGESS KILLED

Wife of School Inspector of North Grey Thrown From Cutter.

Drawbar of Shaft Gave Way and the Unfortunate Lady Was Flung Upon an Iron Lamp Post, Fracturing Her Skull-Death Was Instantaneous-Her Son, Who Was With Her, Escaped Unhurt.

Owen Sound, March 7.—Mrs. H. H. Burgess, wife of the Public School Inspector for North Grey, was thrown from a cutter and instantly killed last night. She was driving with her son Fred along Division Street, when the draw-bar connecting the shafts the cutter gave way, and the horse soon became uncontrollable.

At a point only a few feet from the main corner of the town, the cutter slewed, and Mrs. Burgess was thrown out, striking her head on an iron lamp-

post, fracturing her forehead just above the left eye. She was killed instantly. The body was carried into a drug store by Bernie Doyle and S. W. Watt of Meaford, who had endeavored to stop the runaway. The boy escaped unburt. The saddest feature of the affair is the fact that Mr. Burgess was in Markdale. # FELL ASLEEP

A Trial in the Spring Assizes Lasted Untill 12 o'clock Midnight

Justice Anglin Finally Dismissed Jury and Awarded Verdiet Himself -Other Cases.

The Spring Assizes are still in ses ion before Justice Anglin at the Court House

The case of Mrs. Burbridge vs. Eldiott & Co., of Ridgetown, for \$3,000 damages for an accident caused by falling on the defendants property, was settled this morning, Mrs. Burbridge securing \$600 damages. Elliot and McDonald, Glencoe, for plaintiff, and W. Mills, Ridgetown, for defendant.

The case of Labombarbe vs the Chatham Gas Company was next taken up and was still in progress at the time of going to press

In the case of Buebridge vs. Elliott & Co., the trial lasted until 12 o'clock last night. This was long past the bedtime of some of the jurymen and as a result, one of them was found to be sleeping through the examinations. In the end the judge took the case from the jury and awarded the verdict himself.

The case of Patterson vs. the London Mutual Fire Insurance Co. was settled out of court. Plaintiff settled for \$486, each party to pay their own costs. O. L. Lewis for plaintiff, Mo-Kay & Co., of Toronto, contra. This was a case arising out of the burning of A. H. Patterson's warehouse. The case of Drader vs. Lang was laid over till the next court of competent jurisdiction, costs to be costs
