## PARKDALE RE PUT UP F REPRES

That the residents of Parkdale do all in their power to have a tentative on the Township Council was shown last night at a public meeting of ratepayers in the Bellview school. Mr. Symington was chosen as the candidate for Township Council. All the members of the Township Council were present and addressed the meeting. Many matters of interest to the district were discussed in general talk-fest being the order of the hour.

## BISHOP FALLON BY BILING OF MON

They Propose to Fight  
uage is Language  
Public Schools---

(Canadian Press Despatch)

MONTREAL, Dec. 10.—Denunciations of Bishop Fallon for his attitude on the bilingual question in Ontario and defiance of the Orangemen in regard to teaching French were lauded by speakers at a meeting of the members of St. Jean Baptiste Society last night in Monument National. Feature address of the evening delivered by Dr. J. K. Moran, Bishop of Ottawa, on the question of "Language in Canada," but speakers addressed were also made by Armstrong of the Separate School Board, Ottawa; Oliver Asselin, President of the St. Jean Baptiste Society, Montreal; and Rev. A. M. Brodeur, secretary of the society. Montreal. President Asselin scored some of the French papers for their indifference to the cause of their race in Ontario and denounced Bishop Fallon London for his opposition to French language.

Rev. Father Grosseau, was speaking in his reference to Fallon.

"The Irish are not all against him," he said; "it is but a small number by a certain individual. But when battle is won we will erect to the individual a monument for the good he has done, by arousing the dormant spirit of our people. At the foot of the monument we will carve: 'Bishop Fallon, the saviour of French language in Ontario.'"

"And as all bishops have some to hold their train, we will place the back holding the train of Bishop Fallon, Father O'Gorman of Ottawa, the bishop's little friend."

"I challenge Father O'Gorman to prove his last assertion that his bishop is back of him in his crusade and if his archbishop is backing him and he is supported by Bishop of Quebec, we will appeal them all to Rome."

School Trustee Armstrong said would remind those who wish to break the guarantees of the constitution of Limerick's broken treaty with our enemies we will cry: 'Go to Quebec, and we will stay in Ontario and fight and not spare our for 5,000 fighting Orangemen.'
