TO-DAY'S MESSAGES.

A BOLT FROM THE BLUE.

LONDON, Oct. 19.—The announcement, last night, that the Nationalist-Unionist association had issued a summons for an emergency conference of the party, dropped with a bang into the troubled political arena, and made everybody jump. No one seems more startled than Government ministers, who, learning only through the papers of the action taken by the association Executive Committee, gathered hurriedly at Downing Street to discuss the development. Nothing was learned of their deliberations, but it is believed no alteration was made to plans for to-day's meeting at the Carlton Club. The exclusion of Conservative peers from this meeting is believed to be the cause for summoning a party conference.

A SPLIT.

ATHENS, Oct. 19.—Royalist newspapers declare that movement in favor of a Republic has caused split in Venizelist ranks, and long telegrams have been despatched to Venizelos in London asking for instructions.

URNS DOWN LLOYD GEORGE.

LONDON, Oct. 19.—The conservatives, at a meeting to-day, decided by a vote of 186 to 87 to appeal to the country as a conservative party. It is confidently expected that Lloyd George will resign when he receives the resignation of Austen Chamberlain, Government Leader in the Commons. The conservative vote means that the party will withdraw from the Premier's Coalition Party, and the resignations of Chamberlain, Balfour and Birkenhead from the Cabinet is expected. The announcement of the vote was preceded by reports from the Carlton Club that Chamberlain's statement had failed to satisfy the meeting, and Bonar Law had spoken in favor of maintaining the independence of the conservative party.

SEIZURE IN CORK.

CORK, Oct. 19.—The arrest of H. O. Mahoney, Cork, Republican, led to-day to the discovery of an important Republican base in the city, in the house on Grand Parade, where there was found evidence that the building was used as the centre of Cork, number one, "Flanna," a military organization, named after Irish Fenian bodies. Free State troops, under an intelligence officer, seized large quantities of literature, typewriters, field dressings, first aid outfits and provisions.
