Municipal Council

WEEKLY MEETING.

The weekly meeting of the Municipal Council was held yesterday afternoon, the full Board being present. Communication was tabled from Mr. J. A. Dasha, Shaw's Lane, asking their client claimed the right to same was excessive in the locality having no facilities as are enjoyed by other parts of the city. As no objections to the valuation were raised at the last Revision, the Council cannot take into the wishes of the applicant in taxes.

Mr. H. Ross called attention to the very unsanitary condition of the sidewalk near his dwelling, Victoria Street, and asked that something be done to remedy same. The owners of adjoining stable are to be ordered to immediately remedy the complaint and the City Engineer will be instructed to see that the place is kept in sanitary condition.

Mr. R. Patton, Mount Royal Avenue, asked that the Sanitary Service be extended to the locality. This section is already being given attention by the Sanitary Department.

The residents of the Southside Road, West, complained of the inadequate lighting at this place. The Lighting Committee will investigate this matter; also similar request received from P. J. Raynes, Casey St. Mrs. S. E. Worrall, Springdale Street, asked that the retaining wall at the western corner of Springdale Street and Gilbert Street be attended to. The wall in question is a private one, and does not come within the jurisdiction of the Council.

The Avalon Telephone Company, applying to Council's notification, stated the poles on the Waterford Bridge Road have been moved back to the new street line, as requested.

A deputation from the residents of Malta, Goodridge and other streets in that part of the city known as the "Annex", were admitted to the meeting. Messrs. Lakin and Field, on behalf of the residents, placed before the Board their grievances, which are lack of water and sewerage, properly constructed streets and lighting facilities. The petitioners stated they fully realized the many disadvantages the City Council had to contend with in the matter of finances, and that they therefore were not looking for impossibilities. The placing of water and sewerage in this section would be a very costly undertaking, and at the present time the Council has nothing but its current account to work upon and many improvements necessary in various sections of the City cannot be undertaken. Taking these circumstances into consideration, they asked that in the meantime the Council arrange for at least proper lighting of their district. This was unanimously agreed to, and the Mayor with the Lighting Committee will interview the Reid Newfoundland Co., with a view to having three lights immediately installed. The deputation thanked the Board for the hearing given them, and trusted that a future date funds will be forthcoming to supply them with water and sewer connections.

Reports of the City Engineer, Health Officer, Sanitary Supervisor, etc., for the week, were tabled. Payrolls and accounts presented were ordered paid. There being no further business, the meeting then adjourned.

Herring Fishery
There was a very good sign of herring in Middle Arm, all last week, but the stormy weather interfered considerably with operations. The first herring for the season was brought into Curling from the Arms last Tuesday when Alex. M. Dunphy's motor boat came in from Middle Arm with ten tubs. There are some herring at Bonne Bay, but not any big quantity up to date, and very few people are engaging in the fishery there this season.—Western Star.
