> A deputation from the residents of Malta, Goodridge and other streets in that part of the city known as the "Annex", were admitted to the meeting. Messrs. Lakin and Fifield, on behalf of the residents, placed before the Board their grievances, which are lack of water and sewerage, properly constructed streets and lighting facilities. The petitioners stated they fully realized the many disadvantages the City Council had to contend with in the matter of finances, and that they therefore were not looking for impossibilities. The placing of water and sewerage in this section would be a very costly undertaking, and at the present time the Council has nothing but its current account to work upon and many improvements necessary in various sections of the City cannot be undertaken. Taking these circumstances into consideration, they asked that in the meantime the Council arrange for at least proper lighting of their district. This was unanimously agreed to, and the Mayor with the Lighting Committee will interview the Reid Newfoundland Co., with a view to having three lights immediately installed. The deputation thanked the Board for the hearing given them, and trusted that a future date funds will be forthcoming to supply them with water and sewer con-
