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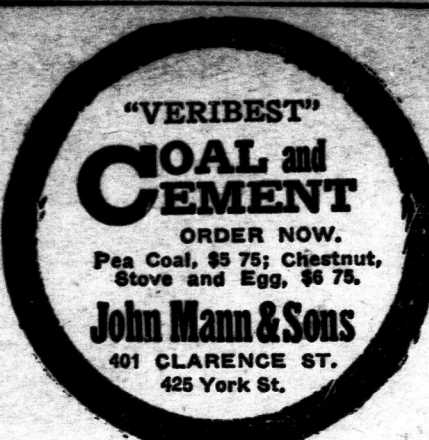

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FOUND DEAD ON THE MOOR

Mysterious Death of a Wealthy Scottish Lady—Exposure Probable Cause.

LOOKING FOR HER MAID

Woman Identified as Lady Marjorie Erskine—Maid Has Suddenly Disappeared.

Glasgow, Aug. 30.—On the 26th inst. the dead body of a woman was found on the moors, in a remote part of Scotland. A large sum of money was on her person, and the body has now been identified as that of Lady Marjorie Erskine, second daughter of the Earl of Buchan.

There is no evidence of foul play, and it is believed that she lost her way and died of exposure.

A man, who was searching for white peat here, found the body lying in a secluded spot on the historic rock of Craigalach.

Lord Coleridge, the deceased's brother, identified the remains from the clothing. Among the papers found on the body was a receipted bill bearing the name of a hotel at Kingsussie. Inquiries show that the lady Erskine, accompanied by a maid, arrived at the hotel on July 30. She left the following day, requesting the management to keep any letters sent to her there, as she intended motoring past in a few days.

The maid stayed at the Kingsussie a day longer, and then went to Perth. Letters were sent to Lady Erskine at the Kingsussie Hotel. The maid, who had since returned to England, is being sought to answer questions regarding her mistress's movements. At present there is nothing to indicate the cause of death. The body had apparently lain in the spot where it was found for a month. It was taken to Inverness, where a post-mortem will be held. The police are very reticent. They are inclined to accept the theory that death was due to exposure and privation.

Lady Erskine surprised her friends in 1904 by entering a hospital in London as a probationary nurse. Her engagement to Arthur Broderick, youngest brother of Viscount Midlothian, was announced in December, 1908. This caused a sensation. Ten days later, it was stated that the marriage would not occur, although the date had been fixed and the banns published.

No reason was given for the breaking off of the engagement.

SUED FOR \$6,000,000

Pittsburg, Aug. 30.—Six suits in equity have been filed in the United States district court against the Carnegie Steel Company by the Carnegie International Steel Company, of Wilmington, Del. A preliminary injunction is asked as well as damages for the alleged infringement of certain patents, the invention of James Carnegie, of New York City.

The damage alleged to have been sustained by each suit is \$1,000,000. The alleged infringements cover the manufacture and use of a self-hardening alloy of iron and steel, the art of heat treatment of steel alloys, and other technical improvements in the steel-making industry.

MR. WALTER GIBSON DEAD

A Tillsonburg Merchant Passes Away In This City.

The death occurred in this city yesterday morning of Walter T. Gibson, grocer, of Tillsonburg. Mr. Gibson had been ill for some months, and came to London for treatment. The funeral was held yesterday afternoon from St. Mary's church, and the interment takes place at St. Catharines.

THE WESTERN FIRES.

Spokane, Wash., Aug. 30.—Conditions in the West are becoming less encouraging than they have been at any other time this season. Yesterday a rain served only to give the fire fighters a brief breathing spell. Today the fire broke out with renewed fury. One of the most serious fires broke out in the Snoqualmie River district.

It is reported from St. Marys, Idaho, that only three fires are burning in the region tributary of St. Marys, and that all of those are practically under control.

THE JACKSON DISPUTE PUT TO ONE SIDE

Methodist Conference Leaves It to the Regular Church Procedure.

Victoria, B. C., Aug. 29.—At the morning session of the Methodist General Conference, the "Jackson controversy" was taken up, when it was decided to leave it to the regular procedure provided by the church.

Rev. C. Cleaver, Toronto, led the attack on the professor of the English Bible in Victoria University, followed by F. W. Winter, Toronto, while the professor was warmly championed by Chancellor Burwash and N. W. Rowell, E. C.

Dr. Cleaver's motion asked the conference to express disapproval of all such teaching as had a tendency to disparage the deity and infallibility of Christ while on earth, to weaken the authority of Christ and his apostles or to discredit the Scriptures as trustworthy revelation from God.

The motion detailed several points as specifics of the doctrines complained of, such as the alleged unscientific character of the early chapters of Genesis; that Christ had proved the Messianic authorship of Pentateuch and the Davidic authorship of Isaiah 110, which modern scholarship denied; that a man may not do violence to his intellectual conscience at the bidding of any authority, no matter how august; that on questions of morals Jesus is to be listened to, but in such matters as the casting out of the devil, ignored.

Dr. A. D. Watson, Toronto, moved in amendment, seconded by Rev. Principal Sparling, of Winnipeg, "that as matters of the motion are such as call for the most careful and mature deliberation of those best fitted to adjudicate; that as the General Conference is by constitution and usage a legislative body, rather than a court of trial, and could not give patient and calm deliberation, and as the church has methods of procedure in cases of supposed departures in teachings which would tend to stifle candor of professors, and would keep inviolate doctrines and principles, be it resolved that having provided adequately for cases such as referred to in the resolution
