Experiment Will Be Made of Burning Coal Under-

ground.

[Canadian Press.] London, March 29.-Sir William Ramsay, in a speech last night, announced that an experiment was likey to be made in the way of carrying out the suggestion made by him, that an ideal state of things would be to

have retorts in the bowels of the earth to produce gas for power.
"I firmly believe," he said, "that something will be done in the way of not raising coal, but letting it remain underground, burning it there, and taking off the gases. I have been in communication with a large colliery proprietor, and he is going to give me a chance of making an experiment on

a very small scale. "If this succeeds, a candle may be lighted in England, which will not be extinguished in our time."


