VIENNA, July 2.- The anti-Servian agitation, which is becoming an exceedingly dangerous symptom, shows no sign of abating. Even while the funeral cortege of the archduke and his wife was on its way to the Hofburg today, hundreds of excited students were engaged in a desperate struggle with the police to reach the Servian legation, within three blocks of the procession.
