Organization Probable in Order To Se. cure These.

With the object in view of securing shorter hours, an attempt is to be made and send a deputation to the governimmediately to organize a union of the retail clerks of the city, according to retail cierks of the city, according to members of the London Trades and Labor Council. The clerks of the city met some time ago and discussed plans for the forming of a union, or an association, but nothing definite has been done. Representatives of other unions in the city have approached dozens of clerks since then and it was believed that there are sufficient numbers now in favor of a union to proceed with organization.
