Details of Tour in British Columbia and Prairie Provinces

INCREASE OF CUSTOMS REVENUE

Marking of International Boundary West of Rockies—Inspection of Meat-Packing

Ottawa, Sept. 4.—The details have been arranged for Mr. Borden's tour in British Columbia, Saskatchewan and Alberta. Leaving Toronto on the night of Sept. 14, Mr. Borden will go to the Pacific coast by the coast route, and will arrive in Vancouver on Sept. 21. He will visit Southern British Columbia, leaving there by the coast route to Prince Albert, going from there to Regina, Sask., on Sept. 25. The revenue of Canada from customs collections continues to swell. For the first five months of the present fiscal year the Canadian customs revenue amounted to \$22,099,000, which is \$5,322,065 greater than the revenue for the same period the year before. During the month of August customs collections amounted to \$5,949,402, an increase of \$1,027,451.

Paris, Sept. 4.—The Libre Parole declared that the cabinet has considered a proposition made to General Druce, commanding the French forces at Casablanca, by Mulai Hafig, that if the signatories of the Algiers convention recognize Mulai Hafig as sultan he will undertake to restore order.
