COMPANIES COME TO AN AGREEMENT

Electric Company Starts Up Steam Plant for Street Railway Service

The Esquimalt Waterworks company and the British Columbia Electric company have come to an agreement over the proposition of the former that the latter company, in view of the reduced water supply at Goldstream, should start up its steam plant on Store street to supply power for the car and motor service only, int on store street to supply the car and motor service only, ing water from Goldstream for electic lighting purposes.

As the result of a letter with R. H. Sperling, general manager of the British Columbia Electric company, to T. Lubbe, manager of the wat-erworks company, a meeting was held yesterday afternoon at the electric yesterday afternoon at the electric company's offices. There were present at the meeting Messrs. Lubbe, J. A. Sayward, W. E. Oliver, R. H. Sperling and A. T. Goward. After a considerable discussion the electric company agreed to waive some of the conditions which on Monday it had notified the waterworks company it would insist upon and to this amended proposal the manager of the waterworks company agreed.

As a result the electric company

As a result the electric company started up its steam plant last night and announced that after a shut-down for several hours in order to allow of some alterations in the machinery, the plant would in all dikelihood be in full running order and be in operation at 6 o'clock this morning.

Mr. Goward stated last night that there was every reason to suppose that the steam plant would be fully equal to the task of operating the cars though since the plant was installed the service had been improved by heavier cars, but he thought a good service would be maintained.

Letter to Mr. Lubbe.


