Council met pursuant to adjournment. Members all present.

Minutes of previous meeting read, and on motion of Munroe, seconded by Kelly, were approved.

The following parties applied for remaneration for sheep killed and injured by dogs viz:—John N. Campbell, for 3 sheep killed and 2 injured and 1 lamb killed and 2 injured, valued at \$46.00; Edward Campbell, for 2 sheep killed and 3 injured, valued at \$37.00; Peter McPhail, for 1 lamb killed, valued at \$7.00.

Spearman—Monroe, that J. N. Campbell be granted order for \$30, Edward Campbell order for \$24, P. McPhail order for \$4.66. Being 3 of estimated amount of loss.—Carried.

Mr. Pavay asked for a grant of tile, to enable him to continue his tile drain on lot nee 16, con. 4,—northward, to drain a piece of the public road that cannot be drained any other way.

Monroe—Kelly, that council agree to pay for 600 tile on account that Mr. Pavay draw and put them in so as to connect with ditch on south side of road.—Carried.

Monroe—Spearman, that by law for McGill drain on Townline Brooke and Warwick, authorizing a loan of \$509 to pay Brooke's share of costs thereof, be read a third time and finally passed.—Carried, read and passed.

Letter from Clerk of Warwick read asking for a joint meeting of commissioners to settle and adjust expenditures on townline. Letter received and read from W. E. Fitzgerald on behalf of Mr. Jacob Saunders, claiming refund of law costs paid by him in 1904 on lot sw 1/4 6, con. 13. Clerk instructed to follow the resolution passed, at time refund was authorized.

Mrs. Isabella McVicar applied for a tile loan of \$100 on nee 7, con. 2. Spearman—McIntyre, that application be granted and clerk instructed to prepare the required debenture for loan.—Carried.

McIntyre—Spearman, that council do now adjourn to meet in the village of Alvinston on Saturday, the 15th day of December, 1906.—Carried.
