The Northwestern Miller says of the flour market: Flour has been fairly well maintained during the week, with moderate demand at current figures. No one is buying more than enough high grade patents for immediate use, as it is the general opinion that there will be a reduction in prices with the movement of new ; spring wheat of from 50 to 75c per bbl., and flour dealers are confining their transactions accordingly. United Kingdom points. Low grades and bakers' could be exported in large quantities if patents could be sold high enough to cover the cost of raw material and grinding, but the demand is only to satisfy a consumptive request, which uses them without regard to comparative cost. The high character of the new winter wheat, obtainable much cheaper than spring, seems likely to encourage its use in some of the territory heretofore held by spring wheat, before the latter is fit for grinding. A little new wheat will possibly be offered early in August, but it will hardly be cured sufficiently to grind before September. Prices promise to be held pretty well until the middle of August at least.
