

By Mr. Dubois, for Mr. Rheaume:—Order of the House for a copy of all correspondence, reports and other documents in connection with the dismissal of Mr. Auguste Tétreault, postmaster at Henryville, county of Iberville. Also for a copy of all correspondence, reports and other documents in connection with an inquiry held in 1931 relating to charges lodged against said August Tétreault, including the evidence of all witnesses heard in said inquiry and the report made by the commissioner.

Mr. Casgrain, seconded by Mr. McIntosh, moved,—That, in the opinion of this House, it is desirable that the Dominion Government should co-operate to a greater extent with the Provincial Government in order to assist the Maritime Fisheries in the province of Quebec.

After Debate thereon, by unanimous consent the words “a greater” were struck out and the words “the greatest possible” substituted therefor.

And the question being put on the said motion, as amended; it was agreed to.

Mr. Howden, seconded by Mr. Brown, moved,—That, in the opinion of this House, the Government should take into immediate consideration steps which would: (a) Provide for periodic medical examination of the Canadian people; (b) Afford medical relief for those suffering from disease.

And a Debate arising thereon, and continuing:
