

By unanimous consent, the Order being read for the second reading of Bill C-100, An Act to amend the Combines Investigation Act (Captive Sales Financing);

Mr. McBain for Mr. Noble, seconded by Mr. Coates, moved,—That the said bill be now read a second time.

And the question being proposed;

Mr. MacNaught, seconded by Mr. Robichaud, moved in amendment thereto,—That the said bill be not now read a second time but that the subject-matter thereof be referred to the Joint Committee on Consumer Credit.

And the question being put on the said amendment, it was agreed to.

Accordingly, the said bill was not read a second time but the subject-matter thereof was referred to the Joint Committee on Consumer Credit, and a Message was sent to the Senate to acquaint Their Honours thereof.

Order No. 4 having been called was allowed to stand at the request of the government.

The Order being read for the second reading of Bill C-29, An Act to provide for the Development of certain Provinces by the Distribution of Industry and for the Reduction of Unemployment therein;

Mr. Coates, seconded by Mr. Muir (Cape Breton North and Victoria), moved,—That the said bill be now read a second time.

And debate arising thereon;
