Mr. Trudeau, a Member of the Queen's Privy Council, laid upon the Table,—Copies of an exchange of correspondence between the Prime Minister of Canada and the Minister of Communications, dated April 28 and April 29, 1971, with respect to the latter's resignation as Minister of Communications.—Sessional Paper No. 283-1/190B.
