Dear Sir Arthur,

Mr. Judah, who will have charge of the workshop accommodation at the Pathological Building, is very anxious that a change should be made in the floor construction so that there will be an air space below the floor on which he works. At the same time he is willing to omit the Steadman rubber tile flooring which has been specified for rooms Nos. 14, 15 and 16, which will also be in his charge.

The additional cost of providing the air space under the workshop by means of reinforced concrete floor slabs and beams will be a little more than offset by the credit allowed on the omission of the rubber tile floor.

I understand that Dr. Oertel is agreeable to this change. Will you give us authority to issue the necessary change sheets?

As it is quite probable that similar changes may come up in future, that is, changes involving no additional cost, please let us know if you wish them referred to you, or may we proceed on Dr. Oertel's authority.
