whose walls has waved twice the Union Jack (each time by coquest), the Fleur de Lis and the Stars and Stripes. Not far off is a scene of the battle of Fort George, where stood a lighthouse our shores. Here too a century ago arose the spires of two church soon to fall in conflagration, here too were Navy Hall and King wharf and not far off the monument-crowned mountain. Whe can you find a spot so fair or so historic? *

* It has been suggested that in view of the collection in the rooms of the Hist cal Society having now become so large, the memorial take the shape of a build with tower attached, the building to be fire-proof, as so many precious historic reare here gathered. It is intended to ask help from the Dominion and Provin Governments, and circulars have been sent out to members of U. E. families ask advice and assistance.
