



IN compiling this guide of the road for the benefit of the Tourist, we have endeavored as far as possible to point out the principal points of interest along the route, to guide the stranger motoring through, and keep him as well informed as one who has frequently passed over and is familiar with the district.

East Kootenay is divided into three road districts. Cranbrook district, commencing at Goatfell and Kingsgate, the international boundary between the United States and Canada, on the west, with its eastern boundary terminating on the west side of the Kootenay river at Wardner, and north from Cranbrook to within a few miles of Canal Flats.

Columbia district extending from Canal Flats north to Golden, on the main line of the Canadian Pacific Railway.

Fernie district begins on the east side of the Kootenay river at Wardner, with its eastern boundary at Crows Nest, the dividing line between British Columbia and Alberta, and south from Elko to the international boundary at Newgate.

The climate of East Kootenay is ideal. Spring opens about the middle of March,
