BILL.

An Act for the relief of Mary Matilda White.

WHEREAS Mary Matilda White, of the Village of Port Preamble. Dover, in the County of Norfolk, Province of Ontario, wife of David Crystal White, of the same place, teacher, hath, by her petition, humbly set forth that, on the twenty-fifth 5 day of June, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-two, she was married in fact, but not in law, to the said David Crystal White; that they lived and cohabited together as husband and wife, but that the said David Crystal White never consummated the said marriage; that at the time of the 10 celebration of the pretended marriage, the said David Crystal White was, by reason of his frigidity and impotence, or malformation of the parts, legally incompetent to enter into the contract of marriage, and that the said frigidity and impotence or malformation of the parts is wholly incurable 15 by art or skill; and whereas the said Mary Matilda White also sets forth in her said petition that in or about the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-six, she being pressed and importuned by the said David Crystal White so to do, gave to him a large sum of money for the purpose of 20 enabling him to purchase lot number thirty-seven, West St. Andrew's street, in the Village of Port Dover, in the said County of Norfolk, and that the said David Crystal White did purchase the said lot and took a conveyance thereof in his own name; and whereas the said Mary Matilda White 25 has humbly prayed that an Act be passed declaring the said pretended form or ceremony of marriage had between her and the said David Crystal White, void and of no effect in law, and that she be freed from all bond of marriage with the said David Crystal White, and that the said David 30 Crystal White be directed to convey to the said petitioner for her maintenance and support the said lot number thirtyseven, West St. Andrew's street, in the Village of Port Dover aforesaid, and that, until the making and approval of a deed of conveyance, the said Act if passed may be registered in 35 the registry office for the said County of Norfolk, and that such registration should have the same force and effect as the registration of an order or decree of the High Court of Justice for Ontario; and whereas the said Mary Matilda White has proved the allegations of her said petition, and it 40 is expedient that the prayer of the said petitioner should be granted: Therefore Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate and House of Commons of Canada,

enacts as follows:-
