of our prefent illustrious Chief to the Prefidential Chair, I had them inferted in the Newhampshire Gazette ; at present under the direction of two diffinguished citizens in their line,-but fill had no notice. Far advanced in life as I am, I look back with a fenfible pleafure, that the prime of life was in fome degree devoted, to help to rear the independent flag of United America. Lianguage fails me to depict to you how very fenfibly it wounded my feelings, when I first heard of the recent indignity offered it,-tand you may he affured, I thall be one of the laft to defert,-if need be: Having for my own amufement, made my remarks on the different periods, wherein it Bruck my mind in the most foreible manner that this remarkable prediction was fulfilled, I fhew it to fome of my confidential friends, for their candid fentiments, and by whole advice it is now laid before the public tribunal, with this requelt, not to be over hafty to receive or condemn, until it is thoroughly inveftigated, each one for himfelf ;--- and in order that you might form clear and just conceptions for my coming forward at the prefent moment, -- You will permit me to no-tice, that I am by birth an Englishman, uninfluenced and unferfiened ;-a native of Dunfter; in the country of Somerfett ; as my parents were, in the firianels of fpeech rigid nonconformifts, there was early implanted in the mind, when tender, the most elevated ideas respecting religious and civil liberty; and of courfe a rooted enmity against all ufurped power either in church or flate. When young I was fent over to Neath in Glamorganshire in south Wales, for the purpose of an education, and put under the tuition of a Mr. Llewelen, a noted schoolmaster, a gentleman well versed in the languages, and was in unifon with my parents, refpecting the right of confcience and citizenship ; where I became acquainted with the works of MERLIN, and can well remember of the honorable mention made of him by Mr. Llewelen and others. Early. in life I was fent over by my parents to this country, to a noted merchant of this town, a school-fellow and an intimate friend of my father's,*-he was a warm zealous friend to the liberties of mankind ; fo that; when the fatal moment for my native country took place, in the commencement of hoftilities, Anno 1775-1 was not at a lofs to determine how to conduct at that eventful period. During the revolutionary war, I rendered this country all the fervices within the compafs of my enfeebled abilities ; at the final iffue, the then fupreme executive did me that juffice, as to caufe the public feal of this State to be put on my public character.
