

MODERN PULPIT HAS LOST MUCH INFLUENCE

KINGSTON, June 18.—In his annual charge to the synod of the diocese of Ontario this afternoon, Bishop Mills, referring to the "new theology," spoke of unbelief being life and rampant.

"It is in the air," he said, "and is manifesting itself in many forms. It has been eating for some time, as a canker, at the very vitals of religion, and now, by its different exponents, it attacks in some instances certain portions of the Scriptures, which have generally been regarded as historic, and characterizes them as merely a combination of myths."

SUBSTANTIAL BONUS FOR LONGSHOREMEN

Recommendation of the Arbitrators in the Montreal Labor Difficulty.

MONTREAL, June 18.—(Special.)—The award of the arbitrators in the longshoremen's demand for higher wages was announced to-day as follows:

A continuance of the 10 per cent. increase of 2-1-2 cents an hour.

A bonus to be given at end of season to those remaining at work at rate of 2-1-2 cents a hour for 100 days.

Wage rate of 30 cents per hour, day-work and 35 cents for night-work for the season of 1908.

The award is binding on neither side, but will likely be accepted by the men.

The board of arbitration was composed of His Grace Archbishop Beaudry of Montreal, George W. Stephen, M.L.A., president of the Montreal Harbor Commission, and Joseph Atney.

HOSE ON LAND-SEEKERS. Crowd, However, Would Not Give Up Places.

YORKTON, Sask., June 18.—(Special.)—One of the choicest and largest townships of the entire Doukhobor reserve has been thrown open for homesteading and one of the widest sections ever witnessed here was the result.

In order to better control the crowd and avoid the long hours of waiting, the mounted police some time ago ordered all those desiring homesteads to be at the land office at 6 o'clock.

The crowd was so large that this order of things was completely upset. At 3 o'clock in the morning a large crowd gathered and kept increasing and at 6 o'clock the street and sidewalks were completely crowded and the police were almost powerless to handle it.

The assistant chief of the town fire brigade was assisting the police in the capacity of special constable, when it occurred to him that the crowd would be easily dispersed if the hose was turned on them.

While Hon. Dr. Pym stated yesterday that the location of the six summer schools, which the legislature has decided to establish for the training of separate school teachers and members of Roman Catholic educational and religious communities, had not yet been determined, he announced that the government have practically decided as follows:

Ottawa—For English-French teachers in the D'Youville Separate School; for other teachers in the Normal School.

Montreal—For male teachers, in De La Salle Separate School; for female teachers in the Normal University.

London—In the Sacred Heart Separate School.

It is said that over 500 teachers have already notified the education department of their intention to take the course. The schools will open on July 2.
