SUITS AGAINST THE CITY.

Citizens Seeking Solace For Injuries Sustained on Highway Streets. Mr. Justice Ross yesterday gave an order, practically compelling one Munro of Tonawanda, N.Y., to carry out his contract by a quantity of wire rock for bicycle rims, from A. A. Scott of Toronto. Munro, who furnishes rims to the American bicycle makers, contracted with Scott to take the rims he needed from Scott, who, on the strength of the agreement, bought the material from the Canadian mill men. Latterly Munro has been, it is stated, seeking to undo by Scott and annul his contracts with the mill owners. The judge has ordered the American to cease these operations.

Suing the City.

House of Industry's Good Work.

The Rev. A. J. Broughall presided at the meeting of the House of Industry Board yesterday. The reports showed that during the past month there had been distributed 33 tons of coal, 9 3/4 cords of wood, 747 four-pound loaves and a large quantity of groceries. Twenty-eight new families were relieved. For breaking stone 840 orders were issued and 757 men did the necessary work. Until April 1 120 gallons of soup was distributed daily. There are 101 inmates in the institution, 74 male and 27 female. Three were admitted 4 left during the month. The annual meeting will be held on April 24 at 4 p.m.
