MARCH.—The *Irish Farmer's Gazette* says: "A native of Russia has discovered a process by which timber, though newly felled, may become so hard as to resist the influences of the most trying climates for an almost indefinite period. The most curious part of the invention is, that it does not involve the use of chemicals of any sort, such as steeping in creosote, &c., and that the process is applied to the tree while growing. The inventor is now making arrangements for the supply of his timber to railway contractors in England, and will not require any remuneration further than the amount which should be paid for ordinary timber. The inventor of the new process of preparing timber asserts that he will supply an article which need not be disturbed for fifty years."
