FIRST WHITE GIRL IN WIARTON DIST. DIES IN NANAIMO

WIARTON, Oct. 28.—The death occurred at Nanaimo, B.C., of one of the oldest residents of this locality, Mrs. Mary Pettman. She came as a child of nine years from Owen Sound to Colpoy's Bay, where her father, Mr. Bull, was the first settler. At the age of seventeen she spent a winter at Cumberland, near Ottawa, with her grandfather, where she attended grammar school. The following year she taught at Colpoy's Bay, and the next year she was married.

An interesting fact is that Mrs. Pettman was the first white girl in this part of the peninsula. After living for several years at Woodstock and London, the family returned to Colpoy's and a little later to Wiarton, where the most of the children were educated. This death is the first break in the family of nine of the late William Bull, who himself was the founder of the Canadian Echo, the Wiarton newspaper.
