MINOR BALL LEAGUES IN NEED OF ASSISTANCE

Three-Eye President Has Feasible Plan He is Asked to Lay Before Majors.

Chicago, Dec. 20.—A. R. Tearney, president of the Three-Eye League territory, was today invited by President Johnson of the American League to appear before the meeting of the National Commission in Cincinnati January 8th to present a plan which Tearney believes will relieve the financial condition of minor leagues. President Tearney proposes a reclassification and readjustment of minor league territory.

This is necessary, he believes, to save some minor organizations, particularly in the central west, from ruin. Mr. Tearney also desires to have the optional agreement under which players are sent to the minor leagues by the majors changed radically.

President Tearney of the National League and President Johnson of the American League favor legislation to improve the situation. Edward G. Barrow, president of the International League, favors the Tearney plan.

ICE RACE MEET FOR DELORIMER PARK

Montreal, Dec. 20.—Five thousand dollars will be distributed in purses at the ice racing meet to be held at Delorimer Park during the six days' racing, which opens January 18 and continues until January 24.

More than fifty horses are already stabled at the track, and Messrs. Dan Breton, horseman, who are promoting the meeting, are already assured of the success of the venture. A large squad of getting the track in shape and a good surface had been provided for the work.

Three races will be run off each day, and for each a purse of \$300 has been hung up. The entry blanks provide for both classes. There is also a five-mile dash billed for the closing day.

NEW ORLEANS HORSEMEN DEFY N. Y. JOCKEY CLUB

New Orleans, Dec. 20.—The horsemen at a meeting held here, decided to race their two-year-olds previous to April, the date set by the New York Jockey Club at a recent meeting. This action is in defiance of the ruling of the governing body of the turf in the United States. The penalty held out by the New York Jockey Club is that all two-year-olds raced previous to the 1st of April will be disqualified and not allowed to race under any tracks under the jurisdiction of the Jockey Club until their three-year-old season. Should disqualification be made by the New York Jockey Club, it will likely be recognized by the Canadian Racing Association, the governing body of the turf in Canada.

GOOD PRICES FOR HARNESS HORSES

Chicago, Dec. 20.—Returns from the first day's auction sale of trotters and pacers at the Union Stock Yards, show 22 horses brought a total of \$11,800, or an average of \$537 each.

The 12-2, five-year-old trotting mare, by Sarokin—Subito, went to a representative of C. K. G. Billings of New York, for \$1,000, the highest price of the day.

The sale will continue for five days, and consignments of horses from various parts of the country are to be offered.

THE BIKE GRIND

New York, Dec. 20.—As time passes in the annual six-day bike race at Madison Square Garden the crowds are growing greater and the snoring louder. Thrilling riding rewarded those who could keep awake. McNamara winning out in last night's midnight sprint over Goulet, Brenda and Goulet, the Tasmantian pair, are leading the riders with three points scored.

23 even teams were still spurring around the track in a deadlock at 6 o'clock today. They had traveled 1083 miles and 8 laps, with H. Orr doing 81 laps setting. The record for the time is 1159 miles and 5 laps, made in 1914 by Anderson and Denny.

One of the worst accidents attending the six-day bicycle races in years occurred this afternoon when seven of the riders pulled up in a heap at the bottom of the track. Three of them were quite seriously injured, and it was feared they might not be able to resume riding.

They were Carman, Grenda and Bello, were knocked unconscious. Drobach, Eger and Thomas were also injured, although less seriously.

The accident was caused by Bello's front wheel striking the rear wheel of a rider ahead of him during a sprint. Both went to the bottom of the track and the others piled on top of them.
