

MORE THAN HALF CITY RELIGIOUS

Home Visitation Proves Great Success When Toronto Makes Record.

SIX THOUSAND HELP

Ninety-Eight Per Cent. of the Territory is Covered in Day.

The reports from the thirty-two districts into which Toronto and suburbs were divided for the home visitation, indicate that the work was a great success. No complete results could be secured last night from the large undertaking, but it was certain that more than 6,000 visitors had taken part in the movement, and 493 of the 493 assignments had been reported complete.

Many local leaders feared that so large an undertaking could not be successfully observed at this time, in view of the fact that the city was so short of help, but Toronto responded to the task in great style and furnished more workers than were first asked. In nearly all districts there were more visitors than could be used. Some were sent out four, six and eight to an assignment, many groups taking a number of assignments. There were a few districts where there were more churches than did not have quite enough visitors, but hundreds were sent from those districts where there were too many, to assist the needy sections but some feeling that there were more visitors everywhere, than were needed, went home. There were a few pathetic and the possibilities for good were evident on all sides.

Many Claim Affiliation.
The records indicate that a little more than half the population of Toronto claimed to be religious and connected with some church, synagogue or Sunday school. This is better than the average city. Most of the cities in the province have less than half of the population in the church. No fabrication of denominational strength is made, as the purpose of the campaign was not to ascertain the religious and connected with the church, but to place all the people in touch with the pastor, priest, rabbi or organization of their choice. The few unaffiliated blocks will be visited, in most cases the pastors have divided the assignments among a few of their people, and they will be finished early or early next week. PAPER-COST PROBE UNDER WAY YESTERDAY

Controller of Supplies for Dominion Talks Things Over With Representatives of Companies.

R. A. Pringle, K.C., of Ottawa, controller of paper supplies for the Dominion, opened an investigation at the parliament, buildings yesterday into the cost of half-ton and magazine paper. Present at the inquiry were Jeffrey Clarkson, accountant, who assisted during the recent newspaper investigation; I. F. Helmut, K.C., and A. B. Kerr, representing the magazine section of the Canadian Press Association; George Henderson, of Ottawa, for the International Paper Co., and the J. R. Booth Co.; Britton Osler, for the Nashua Pulp and Paper Co.

The investigation is being conducted for the purpose of supplying Mr. Pringle with information, as a result of which, if necessary, he will fix prices. As a first step, a series of questions will be sent to the pulp and paper manufacturers with a request for a complete answer within two weeks. The questions will deal with the organization, stock issues, bonded indebtedness, operation of plant, costs of materials, expenditures and other details. It is probable that Mr. Clarkson will be ordered to go over the books of the various firms and issue a report, and the manufacturers and experts will be summoned before the commission to give any additional information required. The investigation will meet again in two weeks when the information gained will be considered.

Mr. Pringle suggested that as the inquiry would take some months, he would be advisable if makers and consumers of paper got together in the meantime and endeavored to reach some agreement regarding the price of paper. He said that he had no doubt that the manufacturers and consumers could not do this, then he predicted that there would probably be state control enacted to protect the public against the big interests.
