The Supreme Court sits at Halifax on the Second Tuesday of January, (called Hilary Term;) on the Third Tuesday of April, (called Easter Term;) on the Second Tuesday of July, (called Trinity Term;) and the Third Tuesday of October, (called Michaelmas Term).

In the July or Trinity Term, the Grand and Petit Jurors are not to attend, unless a special order be made by a Judge, for the purpose; that Term being no longer used for Jury Trials, except in cases of prisoners, and trials by mutual consent.
