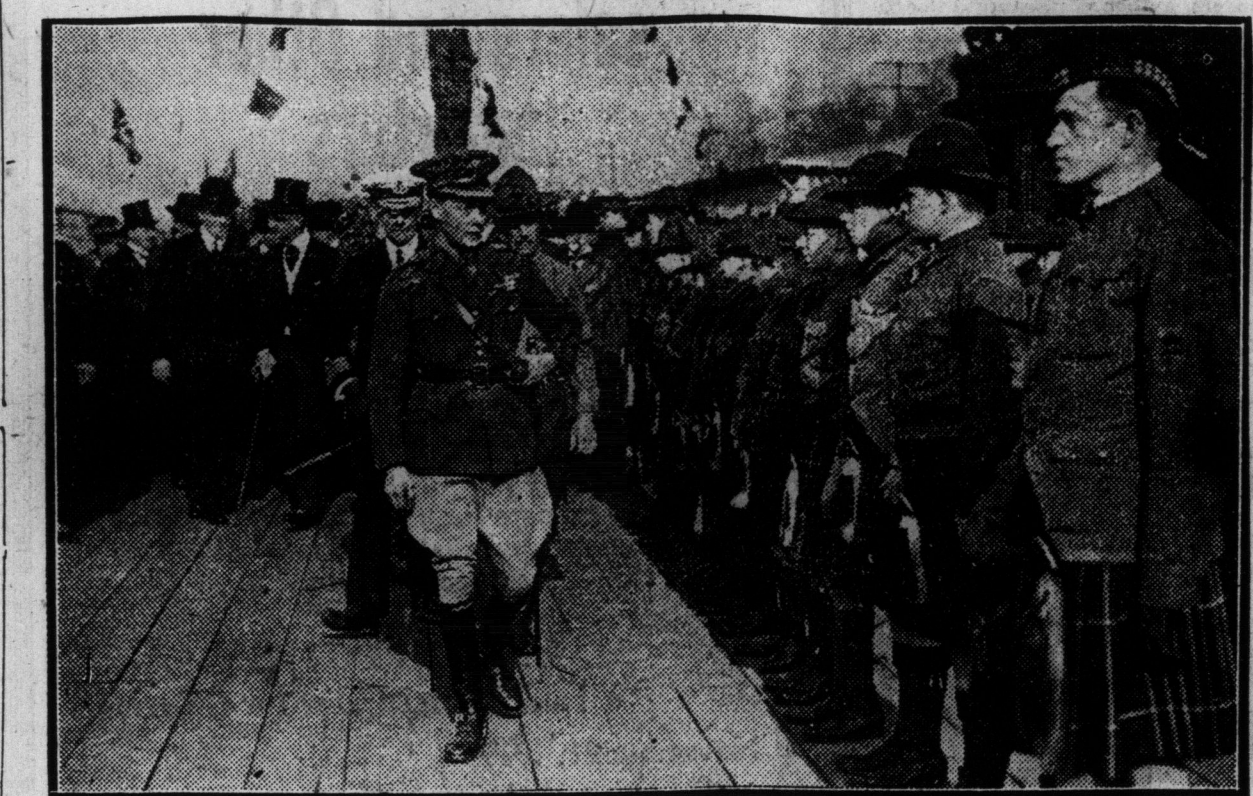

LINE OF REDS BROKEN BY DENKINE'S FORCES

Fifty Thousand Bolsheviki Wiped Out in Battle Southeast of Moscow, According to Claims of Anti-Radicals.

Stockholm, Nov. 22.—Gen. Denikine, commander of the anti-Bolsheviki troops on the southern Russian front, claims to have broken thru the red line between Oral and Tambov, southeast of Moscow, and to have annihilated 50,000 Bolsheviki troops, according to a Helsingfors despatch to The Svenska D.blad.

Reports recently received from the southern Russian front have appeared to indicate that Gen. Denikine was being driven southward by the Bolsheviki. Gen. Denikine reached Oral about a month ago, but there encountered such strong resistance that he was forced to resort to the defensive.

Bolsheviki official statements received later told of a break in the Denikine line to the southwest of Oral.
