8.—RELATIVE TO COLLEGES.

Moved by Rev. E. A. Stafford, M. A., seconded by Rev. James Woodsworth, and

RESOLVED:—"That as a Conference we affirm our conviction that in these North Western provinces, collegiate education should be controlled by the various churches in co'leges affiliated to the Provincial University, and we are persuaded that as a denomination without great moral influence, and of position in the community, we cannot longer delay to provide, at as early a date as possible, for the opening of colleges for the education of both sexes; and inasmuch as a charter was granted some nine years ago to a Board constituted to take charge of a college for male students, the Conference appoint the following gentlemen (see Committees, No. 15) as a Committee, to act conjointly with that Board as need be in taking steps to secure buildings, endowments, and to attend to any other necessary preliminary work for the opening of such schools."
