

SAINT JOHN MAN OVER 100, DIES; ILL SHORT TIME

Timothy O'Brien, 112 St. Patrick Street, Was Well Known Butcher

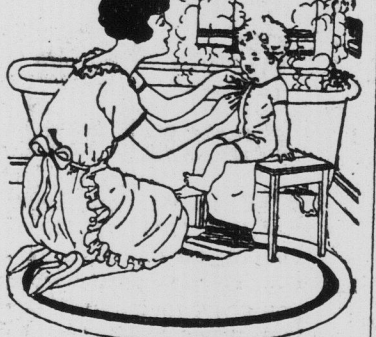
More than a centenarian, Timothy O'Brien died at his home, 112 St. Patrick street, in this city, at 11.30 p.m. on Sept. 8, 1926, after an illness of only one week. He had retained his faculties up to the last and was able to be about until stricken with his fatal illness. He was born in Queenstown, Ireland, about the year 1824 and came to Canada as a young man of about

80 years of age in the year 1854. He had resided in Saint John ever since and in his younger days was a butcher by trade having a stall in the city market. He traveled through the country in connection with his wholesale business and in those days such things as railways were not in existence in the territory through which he went. He was afterwards in the employ of the city public works department and remained in that service for nearly 40 years. He retired from active business about 20 years ago but retained good health and was possessed of a remarkably clear memory. He could recall the old days in Ireland and remembered having heard Daniel O'Connell. Mr. O'Brien's wife died about 26 years ago. He is survived by three sons and one daughter. The sons are Timothy, John and Thomas, all of this city. The daughter is Miss Catherine O'Brien at home. There are also surviving five grandchildren and two great-grandchildren.

EMPLOYEES ON TWO RAILWAYS ASK PAY BOOST

Conductors Want \$7.75 a Day or \$232.50 a Month in Wages

MONTREAL, Sept. 8.—Substantial increases in pay are being asked by conductors, baggage men and brakemen on the two Canadian railway systems, it is announced by the board of conciliation hearing the matter. These increases were asked some time ago, and rejected by the railway companies. Then the men asked for a board of conciliation, under the Industrial Disputes Act. Isaac Pitblado, K. C., of Winnipeg, was appointed representative of the railway companies. David Campbell, K. C., of Winnipeg, was appointed to set for the men, and Mr. Justice Hugh T. Kelly, of Toronto, was appointed chairman by the government.

Conductors in the passenger service, who now receive \$6.40 per day, or \$192 a month, are asking for \$7.15 a day, or \$232.50 a month. Baggage men in the passenger service, who now receive \$4.50 a day, or \$135 a month, are asking for \$5.16 a day, or \$154.80 a month. Brakemen and flagmen in the passenger service, who now receive \$4.40 a day, are asking for \$5.24 a day. Conductors on local freight service, who now receive \$6.82 a day, are asking for \$7.74 a day. Baggage men on local freight service, who now receive \$4.88 a day, are asking for \$5.84 a day. Yard service foremen, who now receive \$6.92 a day, are asking for \$7.84 a day. Yard service helpers, who now receive \$5.04 a day, are asking for \$5.76 a day.

PILSUDSKI REFUSES TO BE DICTATOR

Brands as Ridiculous Reports He Intended to Declare Self King

BERLIN, Sept. 8.—After four months trial of the new Polish government, Marshal Josef Pilsudski, Minister of War and Inspector General of the Army, felt justified in having refused to establish a dictatorship, reports H. J. Piotrowski, former city attorney of Chicago, who recently interviewed the marshal in Warsaw. Pilsudski waved aside as "ridiculous" reports that he intended to declare himself king, says Mr. Piotrowski, who added that the marshal explained that his demand for increased army appropriation was inspired by no other motive than defensive preparation.

ELEPHANT CAUGHT

Only One of Group of Five Which Escaped Now at Large

CRANBROOK, B. C., Sept. 9.—Held at bay for a week in a small area of heavily timbered mountain side, five miles southwest of here, the circus elephant Myrtle, which has been roaming in Southern British Columbia since she escaped from custody at Cranbrook a month ago, with four other elephants, was captured yesterday and found to be in a very weakened condition. Three of the animals were recaptured shortly after they broke away, and the fourth, Charlie, is still at large.

Medical Book Gave Bell Idea For Telephone

While a trial involving the telephone was in progress in Washington many years ago, Alexander Graham Bell, the inventor, related that he got the idea of the telephone from a medical book, but he could not remember the name of the book nor where he had seen it, relates Joseph L. Keefe in a letter to the Washington Star. Keefe, some weeks after the trial, at a sale of old books bought a copy of "Warren's Household Physician," 1861, and in an article on the human ear was a picture of a receiver resembling the telephone. He took the book to Bell's residence, but Bell was out of the city, so he left the book and his address. Upon his return, Bell wrote, saying that was the book he had been trying to find, and enclosing a cheque for \$25.

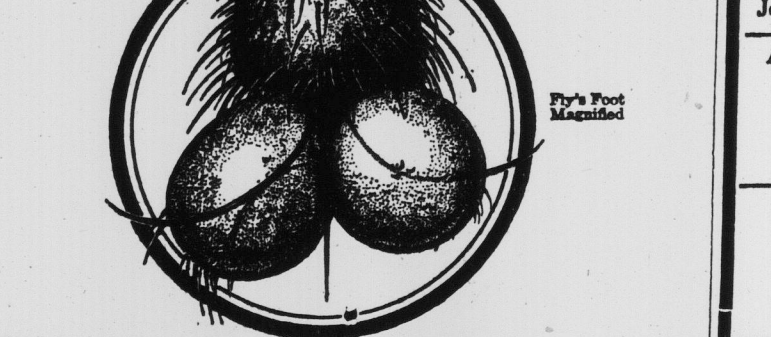
