During the past season 2,000 posters regarding the carefulness of sportsmen in hunting big game and birds, along with fishing as well as the care regarding camp fires, were distributed all over the province and about 2,000 pamphlets with the constitution and by-laws of the association are being distributed.

The following officers for 1925 were elected, as follows: President, D. King Hazen; vice-president, G. W. Gaynor; secretary, T. A. Linton; treasurer, W. E. Hale. The executive committee will be chosen at a future meeting.


Money Collected Ted For Mission Work




