A Quebec Opinion.
Quebec Telegraph: With the publication of the names and the policy of the new ministers at Ottawa comes assurance of opposition success. Nothing is more sure than the fact that the new administration will meet defeat at the polls. The feeling is in the air. It has gripped the man on the street. The people are already swayed by it. It will sweep aside all opposition to the principles of constitutional government so dear to the province of Quebec, and will waft Mr. Mackenzie King and his followers into power.

People Are Thinking.
Carleton Sentinel: To the Sentinel, it seems plain that as the issues become clearer cut through discussion and presentation it will be a winning fight for the Liberals. The impression is that the people are going to take their politics a little more seriously than they have often time in the past. There is to be detected a strong undercurrent that promises well for the future. There are indications that the thinking classes are making up their mind that it is about time for the country to find itself. Liberals in Ontario.
Hon. George F. Gurnea says there will be a Liberal candidate in every riding in western Canada. "Present indications point to a victory for the Liberals in North Essex, South Essex, West Lambton, Kent, West Middlesex, London, East Elgin, North and South Oxford and Welland, with good fighting chances in East Lambton, one of the Hamiltons, Wentworth and Brant," said Mr. Gurnea.

A Prediction.
Senator James Ross, of Moose Jaw, estimates that the Liberals will have from 80 to 85 seats from the Atlantic to the Ottawa River in the new house of commons. In an interview with The Regina Leader he makes the following interesting predictions and comment on the contest:

"My prophecy is that they will have from the Atlantic to the Ottawa River from 80 to 85 seats. In Ontario they will carry a larger number of seats than they have had in that Province during the last two elections, and these with the representation they will secure from the three prairie provinces, British Columbia and the East will give them enough to form the next federal government."

Where Are The Big Men?
A lukewarm attitude towards Premier Meighen has become apparent in the editorial columns of a number of leading Conservative newspapers. Evidently there was a belief that the Premier in reconstructing his cabinet would be able to enlist some big men in the business world. But expectations have plainly been disappointed. Mr. Meighen's reconstructed cabinet is no improvement on his old cabinet; the big men did not join him as a duty, and the question arises, why did they hold aloof? The question is of first importance. Either Mr. Meighen as a leader is considered impossible by the big men of the Conservative party, or there are no big men in the Conservative party—none big enough, at any rate to come to the aid of their party in what Mr. Meighen's organs describe as an emergency, an emergency certainly for the party.

C. P. R. BRIDGE MATTER
Fredericton, Oct. 5.—Hon. J. P. Byrne, attorney-general, when asked today concerning the matter of the new C. P. R. bridge across the St. John river near St. John to which objection is made that it is several feet too low to afford clearance of the masts of sailing vessels using the St. John river and thus impedes navigation, stated that action would be taken in the chancery court, to ascertain the rights of the C.
