AFTER THE WAR

In a call for a conference to be held February 24 at the Moody Bible Institute of Chicago on the general topic, "World Evangelism and Vital Christianity after the War," Dr. J. H. Gray, of the Moody Bible Institute, has been elected president.

TWO OF CASTALIA'S CREW
BELIEVED TO BE DROWNED

The men rescued from the Castalia yesterday are being taken to Norway by the Bergenborg, which has been ordered to proceed on her voyage. The United States naval ship Albatross, which is bringing to Halifax the crew of a Gloucester schooner, Arkona, taken off the Labrador coast in a starving condition, is being diverted to the position of the Castalia, which she will endeavor to tow into port. No definite word has been received, but it is assumed that two of the members of the crew were drowned.
