

NEW REGULATIONS FOR GOVERNING THE SLAUGHTER HOUSES

The following by-laws, drawn up by the medical health officer, Dr. G. G. Melin, to better slaughter house conditions...

1. Every occupier of a slaughter house shall cause every part of the interior surface of the walls, and every part of the floor or pavement of such slaughter house...

2. An occupier of a slaughter house shall not at any time keep any dog, or cat, or any other animal in such slaughter house...

3. Every occupier of a slaughter house shall cause the means of water supply provided in, or in connection with, such slaughter house to be kept at all times in proper and efficient condition...

4. Every occupier of a slaughter house shall provide a sufficient number of receptacles constructed of galvanized iron or other non-absorbent material furnished with closely fitting covers...

5. The flesh of any animal which has been fed wholly or in part upon animal matter, shall not be exposed, nor offered for sale, nor sold as food for human consumption...
