We hope that so illustrious a leader, in so glorious a cause, will animate many to do worthily. You will unite with me in saying, in the language of an ancient mother in Israel, "My heart is toward the Governors that offered themselves willingly among the people. Bless ye the Lord."

2. Report of the Committee.

Your Committee are once more called upon to report to you their proceedings during the past year. The sum collected is very small if compared with that of last year; and it is still smaller if compared with our wishes. There has been a great failure of yearly subscribers, which with the want of the liberal donations of the preceding year, makes the disparity very great.
