Provincial Legislature.
Editorial Correspondence.

FREDERICTON, Monday, March 5.

Mr. Davidson committed a bill to
authorize Richard Hutchinson to reset
the boom across Barnaby River.

North. Co., Mr. Butler in the chair.
Mr. D. gave an account of the way in
which the boom piers had been erected,
by Gilmore, Rankin and others, and
said the charge of five cents per
thousand, authorized by the Session,
and collected for booms, was found
to be insufficient to pay the expense of
working the boom. The object of
the bill was to raise the boomage to
ten cents per thousand, giving to own-
ers of lumber the privilege of doing
their own rafting, but if it was not
performed by the boom master, the
charge for same to be thirty cents
per thousand, or a total of forty cents
per boomage and rafting.

Mr. Tweedie said he had received a
petition from Peter Esson and 130
others, asking that the bill do not be
passed, as if it passed would be doing
injustice to many operators on the
river.

Mr. Davidson agreed to report pro-
gress, and the bill was referred to the
following committee—Messrs. David-
son, Tweedie, Smith, Dow, Leighton.

A number of bills of little interest to
the North, were committed and
passed.

Pursuant to notice, Mr. Willis en-
quired in reference to the reduction
of the staff of the Crown Lands De-
partment.

The Sur. Gen. said no reduction has
been made since the close of fiscal
year 1876 in the staff of the Crown
Lands Department. The stumpage
staff is a variable one, which is re-
duced or enlarged as required by the
lumbering operations in progress, and
no greater staff is employed than the
requirements of the service called for.
Expenses of collection on stumpage
was less for 1876 than for preceding
year.

After recess, Prov. Sec'y moved
that the House go into Committee of
Supply.

(Then followed a lengthy debate on
an amendment moved by Mr.
Tweedie, respecting the granting of
lands to the Government, which was
to the N. B. Railway Company, and
as this debate is of considerable in-
terest to Northern readers, your cor-
respondent has taken pains to give a
pretty full report of the same, particu-
larly the remarks of Northern rep-
resentatives.)

THE DEBATE.

Mr. TWEEDEE said he intended of-
fering an amendment to the motion
that the Speaker do now leave the
Chair, and the reason he offered it
at this time, was in order he might get
a clear and decided opinion on this
subject, and he had no doubt that the
House upon the facts set out therein.
