The Warley flour makes very poor bread, and as a matter of course, the Indians say it will kill them all, but although the bread is not so good as what they have been accustomed to get, I consider it wholesome food, but it has necessitated us in some instances to mix it with good wheat flour, and we had also to issue more meat, so that the process could be used in mixing in their bread. Extensive preparations are being made by the Indians to put in a larger crop of wheat than any preceding year, and it is to be hoped they may not be disappointed in the harvest time.
