Wah Sing was a buccaneer, a Chinese Morgan, with a war-junk of his own and a murderous crew, who bent their evil wills to none but his. Australia's Rabbit Plague.

Australia is still suffering from a plague of rabbits: Ceaseless staughter of the bunnies is effectual only in checking their spaead, for they breed so rapidly that extermination seems impossible. Stock raisers are wirenetting their properties, digging out the burrows and destroying all surface cover. The Government is helping by selling wire netting at a nominal price. In the hot districts they are poisoning the water.

Notwithstanding all the trapping, poisoning, fumigating, fencing and digging out, the pest is spreading.

Eight or ten rabbits eat or destroy as much grass as one sheep. As there are many millions of rabbits the loss is appalling.

Evidence of the way the rabbits are being slaughtered is the fact that from New South Wales alone 5,718,898 pounds of their skins were exported in 1911, 5,650,000 pounds in 1910, and 3,135,000 pounds in 1909.
