

HAS \$75,000 FIRE

SKOWHEGAN, Me., Sept. 3.—A fire which broke out shortly before mid-night burned six wooden business blocks within one hour in the centre of the town and threatened then to of the town and threatened then to spread to other property. It is estimated that the loss on the buildings and stocks of goods will exceed \$75,-000. At 12.15 the fire was still raging.
