It holds that phonography, telegraphy, etc., to be acquired thoroughly, should be taught in technical schools after the completion of the common school education, or at least after sufficient attainments have been therein acquired to fit the student for the business pursuits of life. The Blade adds: "Sufficient time cannot be spared in our common schools to render the pursuit of technical education profitable, and by its introduction before the pupil has acquired proficiency in all the elementary studies, general inefficiency would be the result, and effect much more harm than good."
