

RITHET, ROBERT PATTERSON (*Victoria City*).

Fourth s. of the late John Rithet, farmer, near Eochfechan, Dumfriesshire, Scot. B. 22 April, 1844, at Cleghhead, Parish of Middlebie, Dumfriesshire. Ed. at Eochfechan and Annan. M., 1875, Elizabeth, eldest dau. of Al Munro, Victoria. Was in a merchant's office in Liverpool before coming to Canada in 1862. Is Presdt. of the Canadian Pacific Navigation Co., the Victoria Canning Co., and Vice-Presdt. of the Albion Iron Works. Was Mayor of Victoria in 1885. First returned to Leg. Assem. at g. e., 1894. A Conservative.—*Victoria*.

ROGERS, SAMUEL AUGUSTUS (*Cariboo*).

Parents came from the north of Irel. and settled Prince Edward Co., Ont., in 1844. B. in Irel. in 1840. Ed. in the Co. of Prince Edward, Ont. Unmarried. Is a merchant and a Notary Public. Was Sheriff of Cariboo Lillooet Dist. for four years, and is now a Dir. of Cariboo Hospital. First returned to Leg. Assem. at g. e., 1890, and re-elected at g. e., 1894. A Conservative.—*Barkerville*.

SEMLIN, CHARLES AUGUSTUS (*West Yale*).

Descended from U. E. Loyalists. B. in Ont., in 1830. Unmarried. Is a farmer and stock-raiser. Was Postmaster and a School Trustee for Cache Creek for some years. First returned to Leg. Assem. at g. e., 1871; unsuccessful candidate at g. e., 1875 and 1878; re-elected at g. e., 1882, 1886, 1890 and 1894. A Liberal-Conservative.—*Cache Creek, B.C.*

SMITH, ALFRED WELLINGTON (*Lillooet*).

B. in Bedford, Eng., 20 Mar., 1840. Ed. at Epworth Normal School. M., at Lillooet, B.C., 25 Dec., 1870. Margaret Ann, dau. of Michael Gillen. Was in business as a general merchant up to 1886, and was Government Agent at Lillooet from 1873 to 1878, when he resigned. First returned to Leg. Assem. at by-election held Sept. 1889, to fill vacancy caused by the death of Hon. A. E. Davie. Re-elected at g. e., 1890 and 1894. A Conservative.—*Lillooet*.

STODDART, DAVID ALEXANDER (*Lillooet*).

Third s. of Robert and Elizabeth Stoddart, of Hoddinton, Scot. B. in Owen Sound, Ont., 6 Sept., 1857. Unmarried. First returned to Leg. Assem. at g. e., 1890, and re-elected 1894. A Liberal.—*Clinton*.
