Speaker resumed the Chair; and Mr. Rykert reported, That the Committee had made further progress, and directed him to move for leave to sit again.

Resolved, That this House will, at its next sitting this day, again resolve itself into the said Committee.

The House, according to Order, again resolved itself into a Committee on the Bill further to amend "The Pilotage Act, 1873," and the other Acts therein mentioned, and, after some time spent therein, Mr. Speaker resumed the Chair; and Mr. Rykert reported. That the Committee had gone through the Bill, and made amendments thereunto.

Ordered, That the Bill, as amended in the Committee, be now taken into con-

The House accordingly proceeded to take the Bill into consideration.

Ordered, That the Bill be read the third time at the next sitting of the House this day.

And then The House, having continued to sit till ten minutes after Two of the Clock on Saturday morning, adjourned till this day.
