BILL.

An Act to amend the Act to indemnify Members of the Legislative Assembly for their expenses in attending the Sessions of the Legislature.

WHEREAS it is expedient to amend the Act passed Preamble. in the twelfth year of Her Majesty's Reign, and intituled "An Act to indemnify Members of the Legisla- 12 Vict. c. 33. tive Assembly for their Expenses in attending the Sessions 5 of the Legislature," in the manner hereinafter mentioned :

Be it therefore enacted, &c.,

That for and notwithstanding any thing in the Act first Allowance to above cited, the allowance to each Member of the Le-Members per gislative Assembly attending at any Session thereof, shall

- 10 be ten shillings for each day's attendance thereat, and for the distance by him travelled in coming to attend such Mileage. Session from his place of residence to the place where such Session is held, or in returning from such last mentioned place to his place of residence, three pence for
- 15 each mile so travelled during the season in which the navigation is open, and six pence for each mile so travelled during the season in which the navigation is closed : but such mileage shall only be claimed once during a Session.

And be it enacted, That for and notwithstanding On what con-any thing in the said Act, no Member shall be entitled to bers shall be 20 any such allowance as aforesaid, unless he shall have entitled to actually attended the sitting of the said Legislative As- such allowsembly on at least thirty days during the Session; unless
- 25 such Member shall have been prevented from so attending by some cause allowed by the House to be valid, or shall have had leave of absence for some cause allowed by the House as valid, for such period in either case as not to leave thirty days on which he could attend as
- 30 aforesaid, or unless there shall not have been thirty sitting days in the Session, and the Member shall have attended on at least two thirds of such days: and the declaration to be made by each Member shall be so worded as to shew that he is entitled to the allowance he claims, under
