CAP. CVI.

An Act for increasing the Duty on Rum and other Spirits imported into Newfoundland from the British Colonies and Plantations on the Continent of America, and charging a Duty on Spirits imported into Newfoundland from His Majesty's Colonies in the West Indies. [9th July 1812.]

YHEREAS it is expedient that the Duty now payable on Rum and other Spirits imported into the Island of Newfoundland fhould cease and determine, and that other Duties should be imposed in lieu thereof; be it therefore enacted by the King's most Excellent Majefty, by and with the Advice and Confent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this prefent Parliament affembled, and by A Duty to the Authority of the fame, That, from and after the First Day of September One thousand eight hundred and twelve, there shall be raised, levied, ported into collected, and paid upon every Gallon of Rum or other Spirits imported Newfound-into the foid Mand of Newfound from the Pairle Charles of Newfound-land with into the faid Ifland of Newfoundland from any British Colony or Planta- land, viz. tion in the West Indies a Duty of Sixpence; and upon every Gallon of lon from the Rum or other Spirite imported into the frid Hand of Newfoundland from the Rum or other Spirits imported into the faid Island of Newfoundland from West Indies, any of His Majesty's Colonies or Plantations on the Continent of America, 1s. 6d. per or from Great Britain or Ireland, a Duty of One Shilling and Sixpence; Gallon from fuch Duties to be fued for recovered and applied in the like Manner and Colonies in under the like Penalties and Forfeitures as are provided in an Act made America, &c. in the Fifteenth Year of His prefent Majefty's Reign, intituled An Act for 15 G.3. c.31. the Encouragement of the Fisheries carried on from Great Britain and Ireland, n O
