Portage la Prairie. September 30, 1925.

Dear Dr. Anderson:

Just received your letter of the 27th. I am pleased about the arrangements for Saskatoon, but would indeed like to have only one meeting. Two meetings come rather hard on the one night, especially after a pressingly busy day. However, if it cannot be avoided it cannot.

What you say with respect to the Hudson's Bay Railway is very reasonable and I fully expect myself to be able to do quite as much as is suggested in this letter. The holding out of the completion of the road as a naked and unblushing bribe is about as sordid politics as have ever disgraced a country.
