Ottawa, February 20th 1934

I shall be pleased to receive from you a list showing the names of all the families of Indians belonging to the English River, Albany, and Moose Factory bands who are still at Mattice. As you are well aware it is the Department's desire that any Indians who are depending upon the Governmenter relief, should return to the district where they took treaty in order to be under the direct supervision of the Indian Agent. If the Department's orders have been carried out I do not think that there will be any need for Mr. Awrey to come to Mattice this summer. I am quite sure that you will be good enough to make application for any Indians from the above bands for their ansuity. In doing so please be good enough to account for any changes which may have since they were last paid.
