OTTAWA, 14th September, 1905

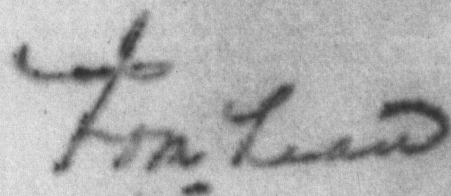
Sir,

I have to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 4th instant with reference to the winter's supply of coal for the three schools on the Caughnawaga reserve, and in reply I beg to say that you are hereby authorized to arrange with the missionaries on the reserve for obtaining the necessary quantity of coal for these schools, six tons for each of the Roman Catholic schools and four for the Methodist school.

Father Melancon and Rev. Mr Oke both informed Mr. Benson when he was in Caughnawaga a short time ago that they would be bringing in coal for their own use and would be willing to supply their respective schools with the above quantities at \$7.00 a ton, laid down.

Please attend to this matter at once.
