Dear Mr. Jackson -

I am in receipt of a communication from the Superintendent, Children's Act of Manitoba, with reference to the Sabiston family in the Fairford district. In the letter the Superintendent states that he has had a communication from you, stating what it might be possible to ~~do~~ with the children of this family in view of our Indian schools.

As you are aware, our appropriation is limited to the maintenance of Indian children, or half-breed children ~~from~~, the Indian mode of life on reserves. It is not possible, therefore, for us to undertake the education and maintenance of white children.
