On the 14th June 1918 the Department asked you to submit a report on the subject of hospital accommodation in the Lytton long. You replied under date the 3nd July stating that you propose to submit the report at an early date, but up to the present it has not been received. The Department desires that you will give this matter your early attention.

Under date the 15th ultimo Mr. Macleod, the Acting Indian sent, at Lytton, submitted to the Department a letter which he had received from Archdeacon Pugh, in which the latter pointed out the difficulty experienced in financing the Lytton Rospital. This institution, which is paid at the rate of \$1.00 per diem for each Indian patient cared for at the hospital, has earned during the current fiscal year \$1545.00. Payment for June and September quarters to the amount of \$564.00 has already been made, and the Department received under cover of the letter referred to the returns for December and March quarters, payment of which is about to be made.
